Historic Centers Now Open

Don't forget our town's two interesting Historic Centers, when you are entertaining your summer visitors. The Jaricho Historic Center opened on June 30th with its annual Silver Tea. It will be open every Wednesday, Friday and Saturday during the summer from 2-5 PM. The Barn Museum holds many artifacts of early Cape life and the 1801 Jericho House, which was recently featured in Colonial Magazine, is a beautiful example of a full-Cape house.

The Josiah Dennis Manse on the North-side was built for the Reverend Josiah Dennis in 1739. It houses some beautiful period furniture and a library of historic information. The Manse is open on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 2-4 PM and by appointment.

The houses are town owned and are managed by committees appointed by the Selectmen. Mrs. Anson Howes is Chairman for the Committee for the Manse and Mr. Parmalee Fitch for the Jericho Historic Center. Both work tirelessly to keep our Historic Centers at their finest. Admissions are free, although your donations are welcome. A booklet about the two centers, A Tale of Two Houses, by W. Jeremiah Burke, can be purchased at either house.

The Streets of Our Town

Cove Road begins on Main Street in South Dennis and goes down to Bass River at Grand Cove. Cove Road also begins at Route 20 in West Dennis and ends at Grand Cove. This is not just a coincidence, but an historical reminder of the importance of the Cove in the past of the town of Dennis. Once it was filled with two and three-masted coast-wise schooners, packet ships, and fishing boats, taking refuge against a strong sou'wester. The roads from the homes of the Captains and crews of these vessels in South and West Dennis to the Cove were once connected by a wooden draw bridge--and formed a vital link between the two villages. In the early 1900's the bridge was destroyed by storms and the town voted not to rebuild it. Folks who now have to brave the hazards of Route 28 may wish it were back, to unite two of the loveliest streets of our town.
