WHERE IN THE WORLD WAS NICTHEROY HALL?

Quite a few of you have offered your opinion or suggestions about how to determine where this building stood. It was the site of the Memorial Day celebration in 1896, but the location as mentioned is only "West Dennis." Perhaps a few more clues will help to solve the mystery.

First, the name. My encyclopedia says it is the old spelling of Nitheroy, which is the capital of the Brazilian state of Rio de Janeiro. It is possible that a West Dennis sea captain visited there and brought the name to our town.

Second, the location. The newspaper account of June 6, 1896, mentions that the group formed a line of march and "marched around the square," a distance of about one mile. The only "square" I can think of in West Dennis is formed by Main Street, Fisk Street, and School Street, with the fourth side either Pond Street, forming a small square of less than a half mile, or Pleasant Street, a tad over a mile. Can any one think of another square?

Third, the size. Both the program and the account in the Yarmouth Register indicate that 400 or so people had dinner in the Lower Level between 12 noon and 12:45 P.M. and that 2500 people attended the ceremony in the third floor. Doric Hall which stood on Pond Street until about 1946, was much too small. Anyway, events are announced to be taking place in Doric Hall in the Register very close to the date of this event. One of our faithful readers has suggested the original hall of the Knights of Pythias, which organized in West Dennis in 1896, but that hall was above stores on Main Street near School Street which from pictures do not appear to be three stories or even two stories high, Also it hardly seems likely that a brand new organization would have so large a meeting place.

Dennis news of a meeting place called "Baker's Hall." In as much as
Mr. Frederick Baker is mentioned as kindly allowing the use of
Nictheroy Hall for these ceremonies, that must be considered a
possibility. Notes transcribed by Ellen N.B. Shaw from reminiscences
of Miss Bessie Howes, long-time librarian of West Dennis, state that
Baker's Hall was over the harness shop of S.F. Baker on School Street
about where the West Dennis Public Market is now. Baker's Hall was
reportedly the place where a meeting was called to organize the shoe
factory which was built in West Dennis in 1887 next to the West Dennis
Community Building. But would a hall over a harness shop be so large?
I'm betting on the old shoe factory itself!

Operation of the West Dennis Shoe Factory, which succeeded the original stock company, known as Casey Brothers Shoes, ended in 1894. Part of the building was used by Hiram C. Crowell as a grain store. Joseph Baker also had a bake shop on the premises. I have found no mention, however, of its use as a social hall. There was an unsuccessful move to reopen the factory in 1897 so we know it was still there at that time. The building was then razed and removed to West Harwich where it became the Wayside Inn, situated across from Friendly's. Later it was a school, which burned and was reestablished in Brewster as Sea Pines School. Phyllis has carefully searched the Post Cards collection, and the only building in West Dennis that she can find which had three floors is the shoe factory.

Now a little about how we got our program of the Memorial Day Exercises, 1896. Norton Nickerson received the program from his sister-in-law Mrs. Carl W. Nickerson. Some of you will remember Patti (nee Johnson) when she lived on Church Street in West Dennis and attended Dennis and Yarmouth schools (Class of 50). Patti received the souvenir from her aunt, Mrs. Archibald, with whom she made her home. Mrs. Archibald in turn had been given it by her neighbor, Miss Bessie Howes, long-time librarian. Norton presented it to the Kelleys on behalf of Patti, and they in turn have placed it for her in our archives.
