The third in our series of bicycle tours through the villages of Dennis will be held on May 13 in Dennisport. Beginning at Sea Street Beach, the tour will follow a map of the village with numbers indicating points of interest; corresponding comments on the reverse side of the map will explain the historic or scenic interest of the site. On the day of our guided tour interpreters will speak and answer questions along the route. But it is hoped that the maps will also be useful for self-guided bicycle rides by visitors to Dennis. The title of the talk and slide presentation is "Townscape Strategies" and is sponsored by the Sandwich Landscape Council. This program is scheduled for 7:30 PM on May 24. Non-Profit Status Confirmed

After extensive dealings with the Internal Revenue Service and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, all forms, confirming our non-profit taxexempt status have been filed and all documents received. This seems like a relatively easy matter, for no one doubts our status as a non-profit educational Society. But the amount of paperwork and correspondence has been phenomenal. Only as the result of hours of work by Joshua Crowell, our treasurer, and Mr. Peirce, our president, have the multitude of papers, forms and documents been duly filed--signed, sealed and delivered, sometimes by hand to Boston.

As a result of this work, three things have been accomplished. First, all gifts of money or items of value, donated to the society may be taken as a bona fide income tax deduction by the donor. Second, we are exempted from paying state tax for goods and services. And last but not least, our bulk mailings are being sent at the lowest possible rate.

The Society owes a debt of thanks to Mr. Peirce, Mr. Crowell and all suger others who helped to gather the necessary information, facts and figures to present to the IRS. It has not been an easy nor a very interesting job, but it has been accomplished and will be a benefit to D.H.S. and its members for years to come.

Dennis 185 Years Old

On June the nineteenth, our Dennis, the All-America Town, will celebrate the 185th anniversary of its incorporation. Prior to June 19, 1793, Dennis was the East Precinct of Yarmouth (which was incorporated in 1639). The Act of Incorporation was signed with a famous signature-that of John Hancock, then Governor of the Commonwealth. The split between the two towns came about amicably and smoothly, the East Precinct had conducted much of its own business for some time and the East Parish Church was well-established.

The new town was named in honor of the much-beloved first minister of the parish, Reverend Josiah Dennis. He had served the East Yarmouth church from 1725-1768. The Josiah Dennis Manse, where he lived, is now owned by the town as an Historic Center and is opened to the public during July and August.

(Dennis is one of three towns on the Cape bearing the name of a person. Do you know the other two, and for whom they were named?)
